



Academic Year 2016-2017 – CR / HA Sports Premium Strategy Statement

The Sport Premium is allocated to schools to make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools are free to spend the Sport Premium as they see fit, as long as the spending meets the criteria set out by the Government. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils. Since September 2012, it has been a requirement to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that you, as parents, and others are made fully aware of the impact of our actions in promoting the development of healthy, active lifestyles within our school.

In 2016-2017, St Mary's C of E Primary School received £9,721 for Sport Premium funding.
