Sports Premium Strategy Statement

The Sport Premium is allocated to schools to make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. Schools are free to spend the Sport Premium as they see fit, as long as the spending meets the criteria set out by the Government. However, we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils, and must ensure that each of the Key Indicators listed below are met. Since September 2012, it has been a requirement to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that you, as parents, and others are made fully aware of the impact of our actions in promoting the development of healthy, active lifestyles within our school.


Key Indicators:

- 2) Profile of PE and Sports being raised across the school for the purpose of overall School Improvement
- 3) Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff in teaching PE and Sport
- 4) Broader experiences of a range of sports offered to all pupils
- 5) Increased participation in competitive sports

In 2018-19, St Mary's C of E Primary School is projected to receive £19,340 for Sport Premium funding.
