English – Must do

Our skill this week is:

- Use inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech e.g. The conductor shouted, "Sit down!" - a comma after the reporting clause; end punctuation within inverted commas.

Compulsory Writing Tasks:

- **Purple Mash Task 1:** Log on to Purple Mash and complete your 'Alien Newspaper Quotes' 2Do. Write quotes that witnesses might say if they saw an alien on Earth. Remember to follow the rules of speech in the checklist. Use the questions in the 'Think About' box too.
- **Purple Mash Task 2:** Log on to Purple Mash and complete your 'Alien Conversation' 2Do. Write a conversation between 2 aliens who have just visited Earth for the first time. Remember to follow the rules of the speech in the checklist. Use the questions in the 'Think About' box to inspire your ideas for their conversation.

Foundation Subjects – Must do

This week the subjects are 1) Computing 2) RE 3) PSHE

For Computing, we will be looking at using software to accomplish given goals. Use the link below to learn about inputs and outputs.

Compulsory Task: Once you have learnt about inputs and outputs, log onto Purple Mash and complete the 'History 2 Quiz' 2Do. You need to input questions about the Ancient Greeks to create a quiz. Make sure you include the answers so that when someone plays your quiz, they can input an answer and the computer will provide the output of whether it is right or wrong.

For RE, we are thinking about things that are important to Sikhs. Read the information and watch the videos to learn more about Sikhism. Make sure you definitely watch the video called 'What is Vaisakhi' as this is what your compulsory task is based on.
