We will be:

- Joining in and acting out with number rhymes.
- Reciting some number names in sequence.
- Developing matching and sorting skills through use of colours and shapes.
- Begin comparing quantities using language such as 'more' and 'fewer'.

Literacy

We will be:

- Developing in sharing a preference for a book, story or rhyme.
- Filling in missing words from well-known rhymes and stories.
- Using hand tools to mark make and scribble. Making connections between actions and the marks being made.

We will be: -

- Learning our Nursery routine and creating our class rules.
- Learning to say goodbye at drop off to parents and carers.
- Building friendships and developing confidence in a new social situation, new environment and with new people.

Understanding the World

We will be:

- Talking about our families and what we look like.
- Identifying what we can see, hear, feel, taste and smell.
- Naming and talking about the different parts of our bodies.

Expressive Arts

We will be:

- Exploring freely with different materials
 painting, collaging, printing.
- Recognising, naming and experimenting with colours.
- Exploring different instruments and tunes.

Communication and Language

We will be: -

- Listening to longer rhymes and stories, discussing what has happened.
- Using conversation, story-telling and roleplay to share and model language and conversation.
- Engaging in routines and following simple instructions.

Physical Development

We will be:

- Developing fine motor using a range of tools, materials and activities such as playdough, rollers, scissors and threading.
- Learning to move in different ways in our new environment.

You can support your child's learning this term by...

- Encouraging them to be independent with self-care (dressing, toileting, feeding themselves) and personal hygiene.
- Sharing books with them on a daily basis and checking their understanding by asking relevant questions.
- Singing and learning nursery rhymes.
- Having conversations such as discussing what you/they are doing and modelling sentences.
