Dear St Mary's Families

Huge thank you to everyone who made the PTA a huge success last Friday! Thank you to the PTA for organising such a good event!

As you will have seen from the email sent yesterday, we have our SIAMS inspection next week (The Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools). This is not Ofsted and is not linked to Ofsted in any way.

SIAMS explores ways in which each school's theologically rooted Christian vision, drives its work and enables the school to live up to its foundation as a Church school. It does so by seeking to answer six Inspection Questions (IQs).

IQ1: How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision enable pupils and adults to flourish?

IQ2: How does the curriculum reflect the school's theologically rooted Christian vision?

IQ3: How is collective worship enabling pupils and adults to flourish spiritually?

IQ4: How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision create a culture in which pupils and adults are treated well?

IQ5: How does the school's theologically rooted Christian vision create an active culture of justice and responsibility?

IQ6: Is the religious education curriculum effective (with reference to the expectations set out in the Church of England's Statement of Entitlement for Religious Education)?

IQ7: What is the quality of religious education in voluntary aided and former voluntary aided schools, and in former voluntary controlled schools in which denominational religious education is taught?

SIAMS inspection focuses on the impact of the Church school's Christian vision on pupils and adults.

During the inspection, he will observe across the school and meet with different groups of people including: children, parents, staff, community members, the Diocese and governors. Parents may also be approached by the inspector on the gate and he may ask you some questions.

His questions may be centred around 'Learning for life' with Jesus' promise of 'life in all its fullness' which is at the heart of St Mary's. Our vision is taken from John 10:10 in the bible. Our values of Kindness, Courage and Trust are also linked to stories from the bible.

The inspector will be interested to know how we live by this vision and these values and what that means for children, staff and parents so that all adults and children are flourishing.

Some thoughts about what he might want to hear about:

- How does St Mary's keep your child safe, happy, learning and feeling loved?
- How do we support you as parents?
- We aspire for the children to reach their full potential and we offer lots of things to help this such as our curriculum, lessons, clubs, trips, life skill days, nature and nurture experiences. Can you name one that your children really enjoyed?
